Title	CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS – RECORDING OF VOTES IN RELATION TO DECISIONS ON BUDGET AND COUNCIL TAX	

## 1. PURPOSE/SUMMARY

This report provides for amendments to the Councils Constitution further to the implementation of the Local Authorities (Standing Orders)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2014 and the revised requirements for recording of votes in relation to decisions on budget and council tax.

# 2. KEY ISSUES

- The Local Authorities (Standing Orders)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2014 impose an obligation on Local Authorities (after 25<sup>th</sup> February 2014) to record all votes on decisions on budget and council tax.
- It is required that this change is reflected in a change to a relevant authorities Constitution.
- It must be recorded in the minutes of any relevant meeting how each member present voted.
- The amendment reflects the legislative requirements.

# 3. RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 1. That the Council notes the amendment to the constitution as required by law..
- 2. Authorises the Monitoring Officer to make such typographical amendments as are necessary to produce revised clean text copies of the Constitution.

#### 1. BACKGROUND/INTRODUCTION

The Local Authorities (Standing Orders)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2014 require all Local Authorities to amend their Standing Orders to give effect to an obligation to record, in relation to any decisions on budget and/or Council Tax, how each member present at a meeting voted.

## 2. CONSIDERATIONS

The amendments are required as soon as is practicable after 25<sup>th</sup> February 2014 and to comply with this requirement the Council's Constitution will be amended accordingly as set out under Appendix 1..

## 3. EFFECT ON CORPORATE OBJECTIVES

Whilst not directly impacting on the corporate objectives the amendments will enable the council to operate in a compliant and effective way.

## 4. COMMUNITY IMPACT

There is little community impact as a result of these amendments save that they provide a greater degree of transparency in line with legislative requirements.

## 5. CONCLUSIONS

The amendments contained in this report are required to ensure the Council has the appropriate procedures to comply with its obligations under the relevant legislation.

#### **APPENDIX 1:**

The Constitution at Part 4, 15.4 will be amended to instead read (new text shown in red):

## 15.4 Recorded Vote

If a decision is to be made in relation to budget and/or Council Tax or at least 6 members present request it by rising in their seats and before the Chairman begins to take the vote, the names for and against the motion or amendment or abstaining from voting will be taken down and entered into the minutes.
