Report Title:	AMENDMENT TO THE COUNCIL'S CONSTITUTION - LICENSING	

## 1 Purpose / Summary

To consider proposed amendments and approve the additions in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 as contained in the scheme of delegation within the Councils Constitution and the Councils Statement of Licensing Policy under the Act.

### 2 Key issues

- The Licensing Act 2003 has been amended by the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act to give the status of Responsible Authority to the Licensing Authority. This requires the Council to update the Constitution to reflect legislative changes.
- The proposed amendments and additions to the scheme of delegation will improve the efficiency of the licensing service.
- The proposed amendments of the schemes of delegation will reduce the risk of legal challenge to the licensing process.
- The proposed amendments have been taken directly from the guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003
- The proposed amendments also help to address feedback received from Licensing Committee review panel members in relation to their role and function at a hearing..
- Licensing Committee considered and recommended the amendments at their meeting on the 27th January 2015

#### 3 Recommendations

It is recommended that:

- Members approve the recommended additions and amendments for delegations under the Licensing Act 2003 as detailed within this report.
- Part 3, Table 4, Section 105 of the Constitution will be deleted and replaced with the detail as outlined in Appendix A
- Authorises the Monitoring Officer to make those amendments suggested in Appendix A of the Report to the Constitution.

## 4 Background / introduction

- 4.1 The Licensing Act 2003 has been amended by the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act to give the status of Responsible Authority to the Licensing Authority to enable the Licensing Authority to make objections or representations to applications for the grant or variation of a Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate, a Provisional Statement, a Minor Variation, to make a Review Application of a Premises Licence or Club Premises Certificate and make representations regarding the potential cumulative impact of an application where such a policy is in place.
- 4.2 The Licensing Authority is a Responsible Authority under the Gambling Act 2005 with that function delegated to officers of the Licensing Team and for those matters to be determined by the Members of the Licensing Sub Committee.
- 4.3 A copy of the new recommended delegations to be approved and to be included in the Councils Constitution is attached at Appendix A.


#### 5 Conclusions

Delete existing Part 3, Table 4, Section 105 of the Constitution which states:

"To administer and decide on Licensing applications including those under the Licensing Act 2003 where no objections have been made, or have been withdrawn"

and replace with:

<sup>\*</sup>To determine whether a complaint is frivolous or vexatious the following procedure will apply:

The Licensing Manager will draft a report and make a recommendation which will be reviewed by the Corporate Director, the Chairman of Licensing and a Legal Officer.

If in the opinion of the Head of Service for Licensing and the Chairman of Licensing the recommendation is accepted, the Licensing Manager's decision will be countersigned by the Corporate Director and Chairman of Licensing.

If in the opinion of the Corporate Director and the Chairman of Licensing there are wider issues to consider the matter will be placed before a Licensing Committee Hearing.
