CCTV currently running 24/7. Risk assessments , refusal book and training folder to be up to date at all times.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The use of CCTV currently running 24/7, Staff will be trained to observe and detect that all public on this premise action remain within the law. Anyone found to be otherwise then relevant bodies will be notified. The premises licence holder will ensure a Zero tolerance policy to the use of any controlled substances.

c) Public safety

Risk assessments , Staff training to be up to date at all times, The premises licence holder shall, to ensure the safety of patrons, risk assess the requirement for medical provision at the premises where the attendance may exceed 200 people. Or upon request from a relevant Responsible Authority. The premises holder will monitor the numbers of guests so we have no overcrowding issues.
