Welcome to the 6th edition of the March Town Centre Regeneration Project newsletter, produced by Octavius Infrastructure, working for Cambridgeshire County Council and Fenland District Council.

Upcoming Traffic Management Changes

- We plan to reduce the current temporary three-way traffic lights to just two-way arrangement on Broad Street in early April.
- The new junction will be operational at the north end of Broad Street.
- The pedestrian crossing on the bridge will remain closed till further notice. Alternative safe crossing points will be maintained.
 - We will continue to monitor the traffic movement through the town ensuring optimal traffic management is in place.
- Any future changes will be communicated well in advance.







What has been happening so far?

Despite the severe weather we have made good substantially completing with progress, pathways in the front of the shops at the northern end of Broad Street and close to completion on the northern pathway at Station Road. We are thankful for the patience and cooperation of town residents during the week of the emergency closure of Dartford Road/Broad Street junction. This was to carry out essential safety works following the discovery of a void beneath the road. During the closure we were able to expose the void location, remove the surrounding soft material in the ground replacing 30 tonnes of stone and strenghtening measures before constructing the new carriageway ensuring safety and durability of the road.

Riverside

Works on the riverside area have been initiated ahead of schedule after the toilet block and the old man shelter demolition in February. Temporary public toilets have been operational and are located about 20 yards away from Grays Lane. These are open daily from 8am to 4pm

What's coming up in the next month?

- We will continue to progress the new paving works down Broad Street in coordination with the shops, maintaining the shop entrances accessibility.
- The new Dartford Road pedestrian traffic island including a zebra crossing is under construction and will be completed by early April.
- We will be working to complete the paved footpaths at the northern end of Broad Street as we work towards opening the junction up in its entirety.
- We plan to switch to the new road layout in April, allowing the public to use the new roundabout controlled junction. This will enable us to remove the three-way temporary traffic lights arrangement.
- Works will continue to develop and rejuvenate the Riverside area as per the overall plan for that part of the works.
- We will be commencing works to replace the existing concrete steps with new sandstone at the war memorial. This activity is being planned for execution with extreme care and respect.


Coffee & Chats
