All requirements are mandatory, including health and safety. Professional staff management and training will provide all regulations to be applied. A 'think 25' proof of age scheme will be in operation and relevant signs will be displayed at the premises. A record of refusal sales will be available to the Police and Local Authorities when on request.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV cameras and security alarms will be in operation, with a registered private company. A security guard/ bouncer will be at the entrance for the evening events. All staff members involved in the sale of alcohol will receive induction and refresher training very six months.

c) Public safety

Public safety is considered to be one of the main priorities by the premises supervisor. Signs will be prominently displayed on all exit doors advertising customers that the premises supervisor. Signs will be prominently displayed on exit doors advertising customers that the premises is in a Public Space Protection Order area (or similar) and alcohol should not be taken out of the licensed area to be consumed in the street. The notices will be displayed in positions where everyone can read.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at all public exists from the premises requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and leave the premises area quietly. These notices will be displayed at eye level and in a locations where those leaving can read them. The pavement outside the premises will be kept clean and free from litter at all time to the standard of the local authorities.

e) The protection of children from harm

All staff members will warn parents/ guardians to make sure they supervise their children on premises. The challenge 25 policy strategy would ensure that alcohol is not sold to individuals under the legal age of 18. Also the CCTV cameras will be in operation. A record of the refused sales will be available to the Police and Local Authorities when on request.

Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

- a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that

 (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
